
Assembly, Operating and Maintenance Instructions Motorcycle MAT Turntable

Overview

The MAT is only for use as a motorbike turntable with centre stand.

Diameter:	Either 450mm or 350mm depending on Model supplied
Thickness:	Approx 16mm thick
Maximum Load:	300 kg

Note: Once practised this manoeuvring is simple. It may be best to practise this at first in an area with plenty of room to gain familiarity before attempting it in a restricted area. Slightly more effort than normal will be necessary to position the motorcycle on the centre stand due to the minimal increase in height caused by positioning the centre stand on the MAT. If you are concerned that this effort is beyond your safe capabilities we do not recommend you use the MAT.

Please read all instructions before proceeding

1) Carefully Remove protective film from 2off plastic discs ensuring protected face is clean and free from dust or abrasions (preferably in a clean area).



2) Place the two halves together ensuring the previously protected faces are on the inside mating faces, place the hollow bush in the centre of the discs and slide the two fir tree clips from either side into the centre bush – closing firmly. It is very important that no dust or debris contaminates the two mating faces. If necessary wipe clean with a dry lint free cloth on assembly.



Operating instructions

CAUTION

This turntable should only be used for rotating motorcycles, weighing less than 300kg, equipped with a centre stand, that stand being positioned on the turntable. Due to the thickness of the turntable, slightly more effort may be necessary to raise the motorcycle onto its centre stand than normal. Users, particularly of heavier motorcycles, should ensure that such effort does not exceed their comfortable physical capabilities.

- 1. Place the MAT on a flat, level, firm surface. Choose a position that allows the full length of the motorcycle to rotate without obstruction.
- 2. Position the motorcycle centre stand over the MAT
- 3. Lower the centre stand onto the MAT, making sure the centre stand legs are located centrally on the MAT surface, and the centre stand feet do not overhang the MAT edge.
- 4. Position the motorcycle on to its centre stand.
- 5. Balance the motorcycle on the centre stand so that the motorcycle wheels are both off the ground (normally by pressing/lifting on the rear of the motorcycle).
- 6. In this position gently rotate the motorcycle, whilst maintaining its balance, to face the required direction. Take care that excessive force does not cause the centre stand to slip on the top surface of the MAT.
- 7. Rotate to desired position then remove the motorcycle in the normal manner.

To prolong the life of your MAT it should be stored in the large plastic bag along with the spare clips and spacer bushes.

Ensure that there are no sharp burrs present on the centre-stand feet as this could damage the rubber covers.
